Greenwood's History Goes Online



This fall students and others in Greenwood will be able to step back in time and visit uptown Greenwood as it was in 1914, through a new exhibit The Museum and Railroad Historical Center is putting online.

GCCF provided funds for the creation of an interac-

tive online exhibit interpreting research compiled under The Museum's Greenwood History Project. The Project has involved more than a year of research by volunteers on the daily life and pathways of citizens in uptown Greenwood at the turn of the 20th century. A District 50 teacher requested the Project be made available to schoolchildren through a website. The grant assists with costs for design, hosting, scanning equipment and marketing of the Project. The Museum will launch the site, tentatively at greenwoodhistoryproject.org, in early summer.

Museum volunteers, believing citizens of Greenwood County would take more pride in their community if they knew more about the history, stories and hardships that formed the town, have gathered a wealth of information about life in Greenwood during the last century.

Using an interactive map, students and the general public will be able to explore Greenwood history by linking to pages with stories and photos of particular areas. Initially the website will feature 15 "stops" on the map. As more photos surface during the ongoing History Project, information can be added on a rolling basis.

The Museum will also re-open its Main Street exhibit with a new, onsite touchscreen to feature the website, enhancing the physical exhibit.
