
At our June quarterly meeting covering the often-taboo topics of mental health and taking one's life, **Bev Gebicke** remarked on "how much she had learned" from the discussion of "Breaking the Silence: Together for Suicide Prevention and Awareness." According to **Sandy Tresino**, the August visit to Greenwood Genetic Center was also highly informative. "This national treasure in our city finds health solutions for people all over the world". **Margaret Conrad** noted she learned about the importance of balance for individuals with Parkinson's Disease during our quarterly meeting in November at the YMCA, but then expanded upon what she learned, remarking that balance is important "whether it be physical balance through our terrific kick boxing class, or balance in a wider way through the examples of members I meet leading full and interesting lives." **Carol Harley** added that she "enjoyed seeing up close how grants given by GWC impact people in our community".

Jan Saul is “extremely impressed with the sincerity and gratefulness of the many grant recipients and how our gift of funding will help them enrich their programs”. Furthermore, “I’m so happy to be a part of improving the lives of so many in our community.” **Jeanne White** raves about “the nonprofits and their dedication to making a difference in our community”.

Previous year’s learning left a strong impact on member **Debra Moton** who says the visit to Pathway House left a significant impression on her. “I appreciated that we were given an explanation regarding the underlying causes of why people face the challenges they do, including trauma experienced from birth or later in life. This perspective has changed how I view individuals I see on the street. Rather than simply thinking they need a job, I now consider the potential brain trauma and history that impacted their mindset.”

The 2024 “Data Matters” meeting at the United Center for Community Care left **Christine Nowowiecki** “Shocked! The numbers were an eye opener when it comes to local homelessness, poverty and food insecurity.”

And finally, **Rosemary Bell** struck at the core of who we are. “I am certainly honored to be a member of such a great group of women who are compassionate about others and their community! GWC clearly touches the lives of many in our community.”



Additional Gifts Increase our Giving

With every annual contribution for GWC Membership, our Granting Fund grows by \$400 to award in that year’s grant cycle, and our Endowment increases by \$100 to ensure our long-term financial stability. In this way, all of our members have an investment in the success of GWC’s purpose to learn, give, and grow.

Nestled in the heart of Greenwood, HUB Transition Centers offers a beacon of hope for those rebuilding their lives after hardship. Born from compassion and faith, this nonprofit provides structured, supportive housing for men overcoming homelessness and addiction, guiding them toward independence with certified counseling and life skills programs. In just a few years, HUB has become a cornerstone of the community, fostering healing through its SCARR-certified recovery residences. With twenty-one beds for men, they create accountable spaces where residents thrive under the Oxford House Model, blending peer support with professional guidance. Their commitment to reintegration is palpable; residents leave not just stable, but empowered, ready to contribute to Greenwood's vibrant tapestry.



2025 Grantee Corner

Greenwood Women Care is pleased to announce our 2025 GWC Grant Awards! Our collective funds received through annual membership and other designated contributions enabled GWC to disburse \$79,825 in total grant funding for eleven nonprofits serving residents of Greenwood County.

In our seven years of offering GWC Grants, we have made 73 grants totaling \$483,799!!
